- 632 - 2/8/41 - Information that British will sever diplomatic relations with Rumania on 2/15/41.
- 633 - 2/8/41 - Re Russian activities - re gas and oil refineries.
- 634 - 2/8/41 - said on 2/4/41 former Pres. Herbert Hoover was in Wash. and upon telephonic request of Ambassador Halifax took luncheon with Ambassador at the British Embassy. Halifax told Hoover that Churchill was the only influential person in England who was opposed to Hoover's plan, re lifting British blockade to permit the shipment of foodstuffs and supplies to certain unoccupied areas of France.
- 635 - 2/8/41 - Encloses diagrammatic illustration of an American industrial plant depicting typical hazards found existing by Special Agents during surveys conducted in connection with plant survey work. Also encloses an interrelationship chart indicating the direct similarities between the program of the American Peace Mobilization and the election platform of the Communist Party.
- 636 - 2/8/41 - Information that the United Mine Workers of Amer. under the influence of John L. Lewis is contemplating action which will result in serious coal strike.
- 637 - 2/10/41 - Information that Baron Franz von Werra was flying a German single-seater attack plane at the time he was shot down over the English Channel and taken prisoner by the British in Sept/ 1940. Von Werra discusses the British and their planes against the Germans. Also information about change in the Vichy Gov't, Premier Laval.
- 638 - 2/11/41 - Information on Hawaiian Islands about availability of gasoline and find they produce alcohol from sugar cane molasses.
- 639 - 2/12/41 - Information re action possibly contemplated by the German Consulate at Chicago, Ill.
- 640 - 2/13/41 - Information that CIO is planning picket of Ford Plant at Dearborn, Mich on 2/14 or 2/17 and prevent any of the Ford Employees to enter.
- 641 - 2/13/41 - Information that a Midwest People's Lobby for Peace is being undertaken under auspices of the American Peace Mobilization, expecting to arrive in Wash. 2/15/41.

- 642 - 2/14/41 - Information re possible invasion of the Dutch East Indies, by the Japanese.
- 643 - 2/14/41 - Information of European Situation, --commenting on activities of Wendell L. Willkie re lend-lease bill--- also meeting of Mussolini and Franco --etc.
- 644 - 2/14/41 - Information that Italian Ambassador Colonna in conversation with Brigadier Gen. Adolfo Infante, Military Attache at the Italian Embassy, shortly after radio talk by Churchill, Colonna remarked that it was a good speech and last part was appeal for help in the form of tools.
- 645 - 2/15/41 - Information that Hans Schmaus, Attache, German Consulate New Orleans stated that the Germans in the U.S. during World War I suffered and US admitted they had done wrong and Germany is now using this admission for their people's morale---gives information on German propaganda.
- 646 - 2/18/41 - Information re recent Japanese census of Japs for the territory of Hawaii.
- 647 - 2/18/41 - Information on European situation - re Balkan situation and Colonel William Donovan - also Harold Hanon of Life Magazine
- 648 - 2/19/41 - Information that all ships of Japanese registry now at sea are receiving secret instructions through the Japanese Consuls at ports of call of Hawaii and on the mainland of the U.S.
- 649 - 2/19/41 - Information re activities of the Harry Bridges Defense Committee in connection with the new deportation hearing for Harry Bridges set for 3/31/41.
- 650 - 2/20/41 - Minister of Ecuador at Madrid, Spain, on 1/7/41 corresponded with Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Quito, Ecuador and furnished information re meeting between Senor Serrano Suner and Senor Marcos Aguirre,
- 651 - 2/20/41 - Further information on # 649 - encloses photo-static copy of news article appearing in Daily Workers.
- 652 - 2/20/41 - Memo reflecting type of some of the information which the French Embassy and other representatives of the French Government in the U. S. were furnishing to the Vichy government during the latter part of the year 1940.
